PROTECTING YOUR FINANCIAL DETAILS

- Follow all security advice provided by your bank
- On't share your passwords, PINs, or card details
- Remember, your bank will never ask you for your own details
- Trust your instincts if what you're being asked to do doesn't feel right
- Empty your letterbox daily, open your own mail, and store it in a safe place
- Ensure all of your passwords are not easily guessed and are changed regularly
- On't open suspicious looking texts or emails claiming to be your bank or other authority
- Store important documents in a secure place in your home, such as a lockable cupboard
- Discuss decisions with an independent party who has no financial interest in the outcome

Protecting your personal details is an important part of staying in control of your financial and legal affairs.

It can prevent someone that you may trust taking advantage of you, and can help you to quickly recognise signs of financial abuse or scams.
